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

This year's speakers include Edward Wagner, MD, MPH, FACP, Director Emeritus at the MacColl Center for Health Care Innovation Group Health Research Institute (joining us again this year after having been a keynote speaker at our inaugural Blueprint Conference), Michael Botticelli, MEd, Deputy Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy and Kevin Larsen, MD, FACP, Medical Director of Meaningful Use at the Office of the National Coordinator for Health Information Technology.

FEATURED SPEAKERS

Michael P. Botticelli, MEd was sworn in as Deputy Director of the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy in November, 2012. He has more than two decades of experience supporting Americans who have been affected by substance use disorders. Prior to joining ONDCP, Mr. Botticelli served as Director of the Bureau of Substance Abuse Services at the Massachusetts Department of Public Health. He has served in a variety of leadership roles for the National Association of State Alcohol and Drug Abuse Directors and was a member of the Advisory Committee for the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's Center for Substance Abuse Prevention and the National Action Alliance for Suicide Prevention.

Kevin L. Larsen, MD, FACP (Invited) - As the Medical Director of Meaningful Use at the Office of the National Coordinator for Health Information Technology, U.S. Department of Health & Human Services, Dr. Larsen is responsible for the coordination of clinical quality measures for certification and oversight of the development of the population health tool. Prior to this, he was the Chief Medical Informatics Officer and Associate Medical Director at Hennepin County Medical Center in Minneapolis, MN and serves as an Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of Minnesota.

Edward H. Wagner, MD, MPH, FACP is the Director (Emeritus) of the MacColl Center for Healthcare Innovation of the Group Health Cooperative of Puget Sound and is a Professor at the University of Washington School of Public Health and Community Medicine. Best known for innovations in chronic illness care, he and his team developed and disseminated the Chronic Care Model (CCM), an evidence-based framework for health care that delivers safe, effective, and collaborative care to patients. He is the recipient of numerous awards, including the 2007 Health Quality Award from the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) and was elected to the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences. He has authored two books and over 250 publications.
