


Blueprint Map Guide

Tips


- If you click on a practice, the practice's information will be displayed. Also, there will be a link to Google Maps for directions at the bottom of the box with the practice information.




- You may use the search bar on the left-hand side to search by practice name or by typing in your address to find the Blueprint practices closest to you



- If you wish to find Blueprint practices in your county, you may scroll down to the filters section in the lower left corner and click on the arrow to the left of county. This will give you the option to display Blueprint practices in a specific county.



- Other filters of interest:
 - You may filter by practice specialty if you are looking for a practice that specializes in a specific type of medical care, such as family medicine or pediatrics.
 - Affiliation will allow you to filter the map by independent practices, hospital-owned practices, and Federally Qualified Health Center-owned practices.
 - For those interested in filtering by Blueprint Health Service Area (HSA), please scroll down to the bottom of the filters. Click on the arrow to the left of Health Service Area to find the dropdown list of HSAs.
- For locations where multiple practices appear close to each other on the map, and it is difficult to click on a specific location, even after zooming in -
 - When you click on a practice at the top of the box it will say “1 of #” and will have an arrow in the upper right corner. You may use this arrow to navigate through all the practices that are located nearby without having to click on the map icon.



- If you use multiple filters, it will apply both filters at the same time. For example, if you filter the map to only show Spokes practices and practices in Chittenden County, you will only see Spoke practices in Chittenden County. Or if you filter the map to only see PCMHs practices and Spokes practices, you will only see practices that are both a PCMH and a Spoke.

If you are seeking medical services provided by a Blueprint practice please see below:

- Treatment for Opioid Use Disorder (OUD)
 - Please filter by Spoke to find a list of medical practices that offer Office Based Opioid Treatment, or filter by Hub if you are seeking more intensive treatment for OUD.
- Comprehensive family planning counseling
 - Please filter by WHI for family planning counseling and timely access to long-acting reversible contraception (LARC) such as IUDs or Hormonal implants
- Primary care services
 - Please filter by PCMH to find a primary care practice that is supported by a Blueprint Community Health Team (CHT) and recognized as a Patient-Centered Medical Home (PCMH) under the standards set by the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA).

- If you are seeking a primary care practice for a child, please also add the Specialty – Pediatric filter in addition to filtering by PCMH to only see pediatric practices.
- If you are seeking a primary care practice for an adult, please also add the Specialty – Family Medicine in addition to filtering by PCMH to only see family medicine practices.

FAQ

- 1.) What does it mean to be a Blueprint Practice?
 - a. Being a Blueprint practice means the practice participates in one of the following Blueprint programs: [Patient Centered Medical Homes](#), the [Hub and Spoke](#), or the [Women’s Health Initiative](#) (WHI) program.
- 2.) Why should you visit a Blueprint Practice for care?
 - a. **B**lueprint practices are supported by [Community Health Teams](#) (CHT) that work together to meet the needs of their local community. By going to a Blueprint practice, you may access services provided by the CHT that may include
 - i. Individual care coordination
 - ii. Brief counseling and referral to more intensive mental health care as needed
 - iii. Substance use disorder treatment support
 - iv. Condition-specific wellness education
 - v. For specific guidance on what services are offered at certain Blueprint practices, please look at the section above that offers guidance for those seeking specific medical services
